

# HSC-HEALTH SCIENCES

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**HSC 1149 General Pharmacology for Health Professionals (1 Credit)**

This course provides students an introduction to pharmacology, focusing on the principles and concepts related to managing diseases and various treatments. This course covers major drug classifications, common medication indications, and potential contraindications that may negatively impact health and medical outcomes.

**Prerequisite:** Successful completion of all developmental writing and reading courses indicated through placement testing.

**HSC 1531 Medical Terminology (3 Credits)**

Upon successful completion of this course, each student will gain an essential understanding of terms used in the medical profession, including an introduction to terms and concepts used to describe common diseases, medical specialties, clinical procedures, and lab tests for all body systems.

**HSC 2130 Health Behavior and Decision Making (3 Credits)**

This course explores the fundamental relationship between sexuality, decision making, and health outcomes from a public health perspective. Students explore sexuality issues and learn tools that promote sexual health and healthy relationships.

**Prerequisite:** C or higher in ENC 1101

**HSC 2400 First Aid & Personal Safety (3 Credits)**

A study of approved First Aid practices which are essential for survival in emergencies. Emphasis is placed on skills and knowledge essential to the prevention of accidents. The "Good Samaritan Act" (July 1965) will be discussed.
